GENERAL

1. The TAMSAM Joint Sub-Committee incorporating Tamworth Peel Valley Rifle Club (TPVRC), Tamworth Pistol Club (TPC), and N51 of SSAA (N51) will host an open 3 day Skill-At-Arms meet at Tamworth Fri 25-Sun 27 March 2022.

AIM

2. The aim of this instruction is to detail the conduct and administration of the meet.
3. The aim of the meet is to conduct a service pistol and rifle shooting competition to foster small arms marksmanship and establish a key regional NSW calendar event for civilian service shooting providing a range of competition types.

OBJECTIVES

4. The objectives of the meet are:
 - a. Conduct a safe SSAA Combined Services and WA48 service match shoot over one day; and
 - b. Conduct a safe service rifle shooting competition over the following two (2) days.

RANGES and LOCATIONS

5. The pistol competitions will be conducted on the Friday at Tamworth Pistol Club, 328 Daruka Road, Tamworth.
6. The Service Rifle competitions will be conducted over the Saturday and Sunday at Loomberah Rifle Range, Loomberah via Tamworth.
7. A map showing the locations of each range is attached at **Annex A**.
8. A layout of the TPC ranges is attached at **Annex B**.
9. A layout of the TPVRC range is attached at **Annex C**.

MATCHES

10. A detailed list of the matches to be conducted is attached at **Annex D**. All matches will be conducted as open competition and grading will not apply.

CLUBS CONDUCTING MEET

11. TPC has sole control of the Friday pistol competitions, supported by the other sub-committee member organisations.
12. TPVRC has sole control of the Sat-Sun service rifle competitions, supported by the other sub-committee member organisations.
13. N51 has sole responsibility for the preparation of competition medals, funding applications, and SSAA sanctioning of the pistol shooting.

KEY DATES and TIMINGS

14. A list of key dates and timings is attached at **Annex E**.

SANCTIONED PISTOL MATCHES

18. Pistol matches 1 and 2 (SSAA Combined services matches 1 and 12) are sanctioned by SSAA. SSAA pistol shooters are to bring their grading card for score recording. Note all matches are open.

COMPETITORS

19. The competition is open to any suitably licensed and qualified firearm owners with the following conditions.
20. For the pistol matches, a competitor must be a member of SSAA, APA or Pistol Australia and hold an NSW H class licence or interstate equivalent. A holster qualification is not required for any of the pistol matches.
21. For the Sat-Sun rifle matches, a competitor must be a member of SSAA or NRA or other target rifle organisation approved by NSW or interstate firearms registries, and have "target" endorsement or interstate equivalent on their firearm licence. Competitors are to produce their licence at registration.
22. Competitors without the applicable licence or endorsement endorsement on their licence will not be able to compete by completing a P-650 form due to the time delay this would cause and the need for individual supervision.

ENTRIES

23. The combined entry form is attached at **Annex F** and will be published on the TPVRC and TPC websites.
24. Entries may be made online or by ordinary post and addressed to the Treasurer TAMSAM at the postal address above or to the email address designated on the websites and on the entry form.
25. Entry fees may be paid by cheque to the Treasurer of TAMSAM or by EFT to the bank account designated on the websites and entry form.
26. Competitors should note that the maximum capacity for the meet is 60 shooters. This is dictated by time and space on each range. Competitors may enter the pistol competition only, the rifle only, or both. Priority for a place in the pistol matches will be given to competitors who are also entered in the rifle matches.
27. The Sunday match is slightly more physically demanding than the Saturday shoot and is conducted in one non-stop 4 serial rapid/snap 100m-50m shoot of 40 rounds with no sighters or allowance for malfunctions. Competitors may elect to withdraw at any time during the CQB or not commence the shoot, however entry fees are non-refundable and will be used to good effect in promoting further club activities.

FIREARMS

28. The types and classes of firearms that may be used in the various matches are set out at **Annex G** and in References F to I. Sole discretion to determine what category a firearms falls into rests with the TPC and TPVRC respectively.

SHOOTING AIDS

29. Only those shooting aids approved by SSAA for the respective pistol shoots may be utilised in the pistol matches.
30. For the rifle matches, shooting aids are limited to those approved by the NRA for service shooting. This includes no sling hooks and as-issued jackets only, or similar reproductions. Shooting mats and as-issued slings may be used where provided for in match conditions.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

31. A list of the placement medals to be arranged by N51 is at **Annex H**.
32. Prizes and awards for the Pistol Competition will be:
 - a. Gold, silver and bronze medals for places 1-3 open;
 - b. Aggregate places 1-3 open for all matches;
 - c. Gold medal for winning team in each match;
 - d. Gold medal for overall aggregate team; and
 - e. Sponsorship prizes if available.
33. Prizes and awards for the Rifle competition will be:
 - f. Gold, silver and bronze medals for places 1-3 open in all matches by category (1-4 categories);
 - g. Aggregate places 1-3 open for all Saturday matches;
 - h. Gold medal for winning team in each match;
 - i. Gold medal for winning aggregate team Saturday matches;
 - j. Sponsorship prizes if available;
 - k. Gold, silver and bronze medals for places 1-3 in the Sunday match;
 - l. Gold medal for winning team in Sunday match;
 - m. Cash prize \$100.00 for 1st place in CQB using a Lee Enfield No 1 Mk III;
 - n. "Pick of the table" for individual places; and
 - o. Cash gate prize.

PISTOL MATCHES RANGE CONDUCT

34. The pistol matches will be conducted by TPC at its Daruka Road, Tamworth range complex.

35. The pistol matches will be conducted in accordance with a Pistol Matches Range Instruction issued separately to each competitor and published on the TPC webpage.

RIFLE MATCHES RANGE CONDUCT

36. The Rifle matches will be conducted by TPVRC at its Loomberah Rifle Range.
37. The Rifle matches will be conducted in accordance with a Rifle Matches Range Instruction issued separately to each competitor and published on the TPVRC webpage.

COMPETITOR EQUIPMENT LIST

38. A list of mandated and suggested equipment to be possessed by each competitor is included in the respective Pistol and Rifle Range Instructions.

BUTTS DUTY/SCORING

39. Competitors will be required to undertake scoring duties on the Pistol and Rifle ranges, and butts duty on the rifle range. Failure to perform requested duties will mean disqualification from the day's matches unless engaged in other recognised range duties such as range or safety officer.

COMPETENCY

40. All competitors are to be competent in the use of their firearm. No coaching is permitted and in the Sunday match no allowance is made for malfunctions. The range officers have absolute discretion to stand a competitor down if they consider that person to be unsafe.

COMPETITOR PACKAGES

41. Competitors will be issued with a document package at the commencement of each day. This will include score cards, team nomination cards and memory aids for each of the shoots where appropriate.

COMPETITOR DATABASE

42. An evolving database has been developed of all known individual competitors and service clubs in the catchment area of wider Sydney, Northern NSW and Southern QLD. The database of clubs, being information available in the public domain, is attached at **Annex I**. The database of individuals, **Annex J**, for privacy reasons is issued separately only to sub-committee members requiring it.

WARNING ORDER

43. The Warning Order to be issued to known clubs and individuals is attached at **Annex K**. The timing of the release of the Warning Order is shown in the Key Dates and Timings at Annex E.

ADVANCE PARTY

44. An advance party from each club is required to complete final target and general preparations on each range.
45. TPC is to arrange an advance party to stand up from 0800hrs Thu 24 Mar 2022.
46. TPVRC is to arrange an advance party to stand up from 0800hrs Friday 25 Mar 2022. First Targets are to be placed in the rifle range frames and the registration area set up on Friday to minimise prep time on the Saturday. A list of essential tasks for each club's advance party is attached at **Annex L**.

ACCOMMODATION

47. Rustic camping accommodation is available at TPC Thu, Friday and Sat nights. This consists of some van parking space, limited toilet facilities (one male, one female) and large indoor swag space with lighting and electricity.
48. The TPVRC has unlimited unpowered van/camper/tent area for Fri-Sat nights, but only one toilet and no power.
49. Visiting competitors wishing to make use of these facilities should so indicate on the nomination form.
50. A wide range of motels, hotels, and caravan parks are available in Tamworth.

SAFETY

51. Safety is paramount. Any person may call a halt to firing at any time if they have safety concerns. The Risk Analysis and Risk Management Plan applies to this meet.
52. A Safety Brief will be given to all persons on the Range by the Safety Officer prior to the commencement of any firing each day. Separate Safety Briefs are attached to the Pistol and Rifle Range Instructions issued separately.
53. The Ranges are non-smoking areas anywhere forward of the car-park at TPC and the mounds at TPVRC, and no alcohol is to be consumed until all firing has

ceased for the day.

STORES

54. A list of the stores required by each club is attached at **Annex M**. Each of the clubs are to have the stores in location by the date shown on Annex E.

SECURITY

55. Competitors remain responsible for the security of their own firearms and ammunition. TPC and TPVRC will not provide secure storage during the Meet. In NSW, pistols and ammunition must be transported in separate locked containers. It is suggested that pistol shooters bring a lockable box with bike chain to the range.

CATERING

56. A BBQ lunch will be available for purchase at TPC on the Friday from the kitchen.
57. A BBQ lunch will be available at TPVRC both Saturday and Sunday, included in that club's entry fee.
58. A list of fresh ration requirements is attached at **Annex N**.

RISK ANALYSIS and PLAN

59. A copy of the Risk Analysis and Plan that applies to this Meet is attached at **Annex O**.

MEDICAL

60. Both TPC and TPVRC ranges are within full mobile phone coverage areas. Any casualty evacuation will be by Tamworth based ambulance or rescue helicopter, co-ordinated through "000".
61. Minor injuries will be transported by the respective clubs to Tamworth base Hospital A&E if professional treatment is required.
62. Medical kits are permanently affixed to each of the ranges at TPC and a kit will be located on the active firing mound at TPVRC.

COMMUNICATIONS

63. A list of all mobile phone numbers and email addresses of sub-committee members and range appointments is issued separately to committee members.

64. UHF radios will be issued to all key range appointment holders on channel 27. Net diagrams are included in the Range Instructions.

ARMOURER SUPPORT

65. The TPC armourer who also specialises in Lee Enfields will be available each day to the rear of the firing points.

DUTY OFFICER

66. A duty officer will be available by phone to all competitors from 0800 hrs Thu 24 Mar 2022 continuously through until 1700hrs Sun. Contact particulars will be issued closer to the date of the Meet to all competitors and staff.

SOCIAL DINNER

67. A social dinner is planned for the Saturday night at 2000 hrs at the Dungowan Hotel, located within a short drive of the Rifle Range and shown on the map at Annex A. Pre-dinner drinks will commence at 1930hrs. Come as you are. A copy of the menu for the restaurant at the hotel is attached at **Annex P**. Partners are welcome and it is a child friendly environment. Competitors intending to attend are to indicate on their entry form and lodge a \$10.00 per head deposit. This will be refunded upon arrival at the hotel.

MEDIA

68. A separate media plan will be developed by the sub-committee in accordance with the guidance at **Annex Q**. Media releases will issue separately.
69. All competitors should be conscious of the “Star Statement” shown at that Annex and include it in any contact with media personnel. Media enquiries are to be referred to the Publicity Officer.

COVID-19

70. The Joint sub-committee retains absolute discretion to cancel or modify the Meet if government COVID-19 Health directives impact the ability to conduct the competition.
71. All competitors are to be double vaccinated and to produce evidence of same on registration if required by NSW law at that time.

BUDGET

72. A budget for TAMSAM22 is issued separately to the sub-committee.
73. N51 is to seek financial contribution from SSAA.

74. Each of TPVRC and TPC are to seek sponsorship in the form of firearm related prizes from their usual sponsors.

VALIDATION QUESTIONNAIRE

75. Each competitor will be invited to submit a validation questionnaire at the conclusion of the Meet in the form attached at **Annex R**.

POST ACTIVITY REPORT

76. A PAR including lessons learnt and key factors from the validation will issue to all competitors following the meet.

WAIVER OF LEGAL LIABILITY

77. Live fire range competition is a dangerous recreational activity within the meaning of sect 5M of the Civil Liability Act 2003 (NSW). All competitors and range support staff by submitting an entry form or volunteering to provide support acknowledge that they have been warned of the risk of personal injury from engaging in this activity. This warning is given on behalf of TPC, TPVRC, N51 and the landowner on which the rifle range is located.

CONCLUSION

78. TAMSAM will provide 3 days of intense and enjoyable milsurp competition. TAMSAM22 is the first in this endeavour and the vision is to refine and expand the Meet in accordance with competitor preferences and lessons learnt from this first year to become a key annual event on the shooting calendar.

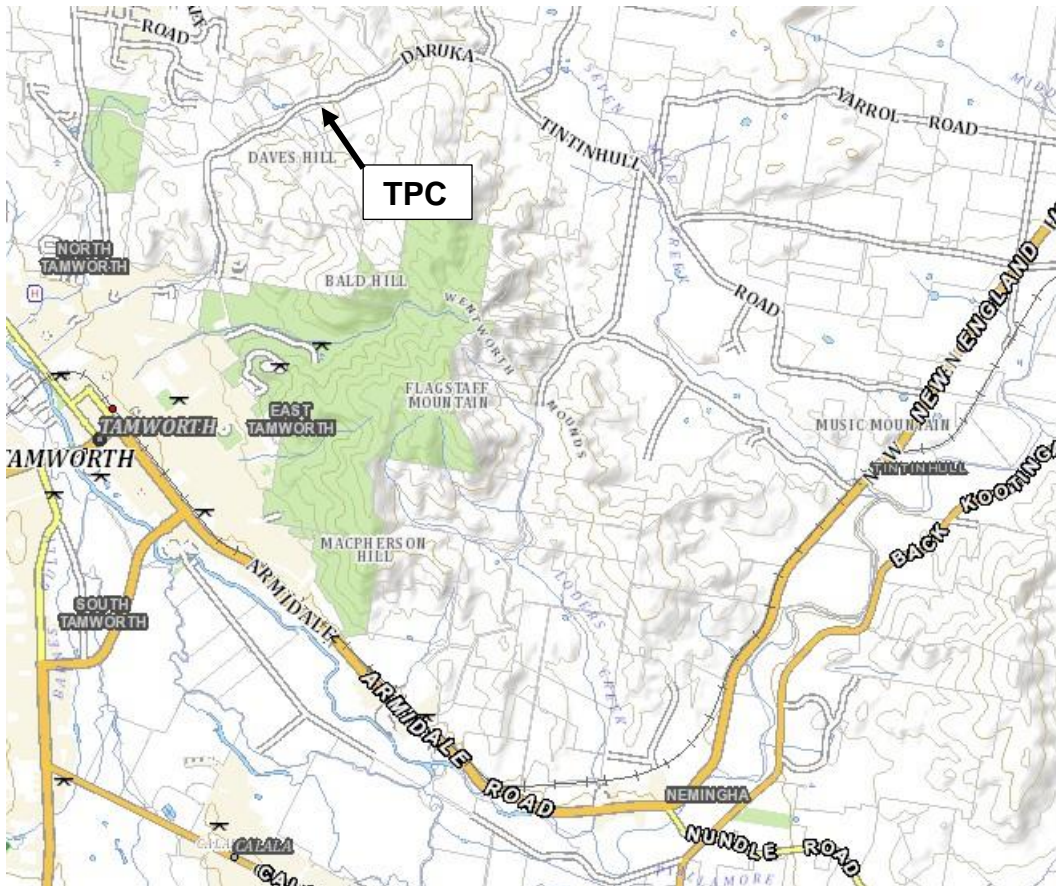

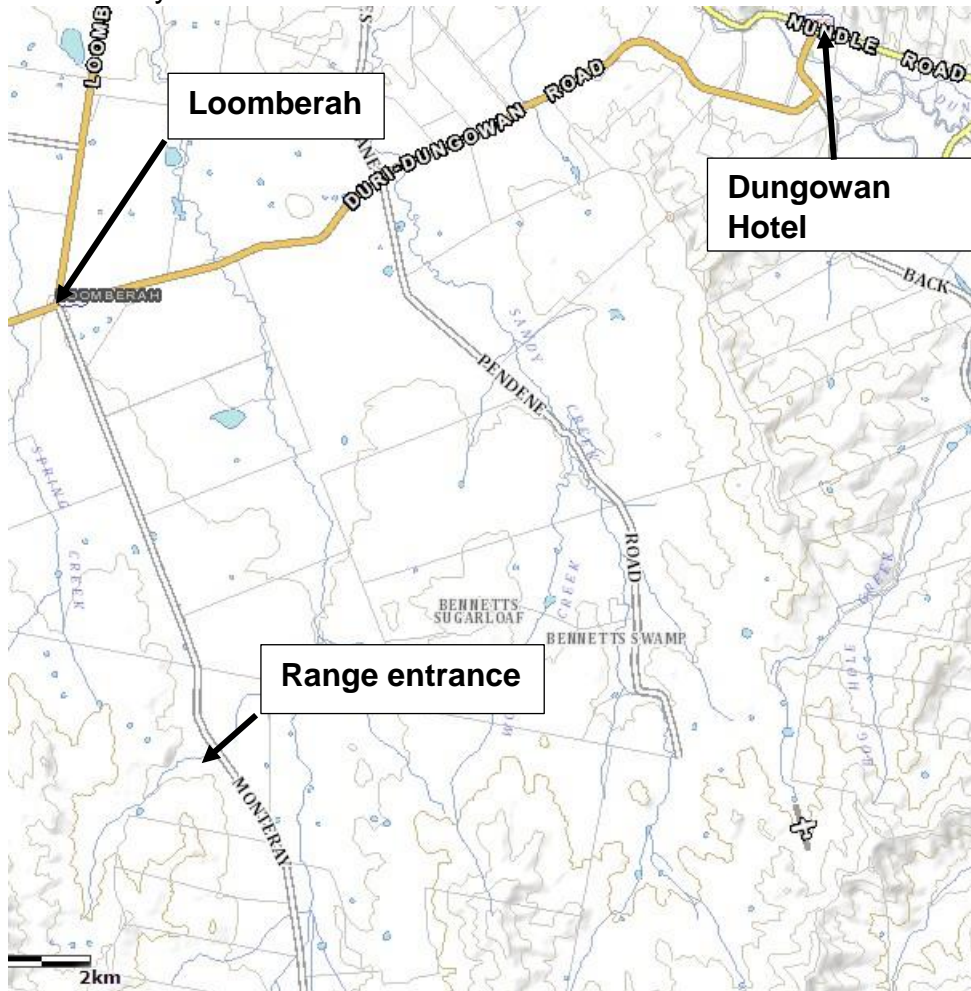
