

Joining Tamworth Pistol Cub

- Fill in Membership Form
- Provide 2 Written References. (Legislative Requirement)

Referees must be over 18 years of age, have known you for 2 years and include contact details.

- Pay Membership fee.

(membership year is the financial year, a sliding scale applies, check with secretary for current amount)

- Book in for Pistol Handling Safety Training. (usually 3rd Sunday of the month)
- Create an Account at Service NSW. All applications are now done online.

For your Probationary Pistol Licence, You will need:

- Your membership Receipt
- “Pistol Handling Course Completion Certificate” (buff coloured form)
- Credit Card

Your application will be reviewed by the TPC Committee.

After you have received your Probationary Pistol License:

- Notify Club Secretary the date you receive your Probationary Pistol Licence, so your club records can be updated with your Licence number and your FAR Customer number.
- This is the date that your 12 month Probation starts.
- From that date, you have 6 months to complete your 3 competition shoots on your “Completion Certificate Pistol Firearms Safety Training Course” (yellow form)
- If you do not complete this form, the club is required to provide FAR with a “Failure to Complete” form that will result in the cancellation of your “Probationary Pistol Licence”.
- During this time you should organise your “Safe Storage” and have it inspected by the police.
- At the end of the 6 month period you are able to submit a “Permit to Acquire” which enables you to acquire your first pistol.

FAR will notify you (usually a couple of months before your Probationary Pistol Licence expires) to apply for your Full Pistol License.
